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2005 Legislative Positions

CCLC is monitoring and / or working with the Authors on a number of other Bills. This list only includes those we support or oppose as of today.

Support

AB 6 (Chan): Raises the tax rate on the highest income Californians, expected to generate more than \$3 billion per year.

AB 48 (Lieber): Increases the minimum wage.

AB 266 (DeVore): Requires local jurisdictions to make available the cost of permit review for large family child care and prohibits prepayment.

AB 368 (Evans): CalWORKs implementation bill.

AB 700 (Horton): Removes community college grant requirement that applicant must have graduated from high school within 18 months of applying.

AB 772 (Chan/Frommer): Provides health coverage to all children, through expanding access to Healthy Families and Medi-Cal.

AB 788 (Montanez): Establishes pilot projects to increase the education of family child care providers with limited English capacity.

SB 437 (Escutia/Alquist): Provides health coverage to all children, through expanding access to Healthy Families and Medi-Cal.

SB 604 (Escutia): Establishes an additional year of funding for Inclusion training programs.

Oppose

AB 122 (Spitzer): Requires family child care providers to annually certify under penalty of perjury that they have insurance, a bond or affidavits from families.

AB 617 (Benoit): Requires DSS to establish statewide grading system for child care facilities based on health and safety violations.

AB 811 (Matthews): Requires Health and Humans Services Secretary to review licensing programs to determine feasibility of consolidating functions.

AB 1697 (Pavley): Prohibits creation of new child care centers within 650 feet of high traffic roadways and certain industrial sites, with limited exceptions.

SB 539 (Ashburn): Requires license-exempt providers to be registered with Trustline or exempt before receiving subsidy payments.

Oppose unless amended

AB 1246 (Wolk): Authorizes CDE to develop content standards in the state preschool program.
