What Are Child Care Family Fees?



First, let's be clear:

Child care gives people freedom to work & go to school.

Families deserve to choose their child care.



But family fees mean many families struggle to afford child care.

Family fees are what many families must pay if they receive a child care subsidy.

These families are mostly Black, Latinx, and other families of color who haven't been able to build wealth due to centuries of racist laws.



The idea behind family fees stems from the myth of the 'welfare queen,' and the idea that families in poverty don't deserve help without severe restrictions.

"Families shouldn't be worried about losing their child care because they can't pay family fees. That money is needed for bills, for shoes and clothes for our kids. Why is California penalizing parents?"

California collects \$68 million every year to fund subsidized child care from these families, who are mostly mothers of color working low-paid jobs.

The families paying family fees are our essential workers, fighting the effects of racism and higher costs of living during COVID-19.



"During COVID, all my household costs have gone up, and now I have to decide if I pay my family fee, pay PG&E, or improve my internet connection for my older son's distance learning. The stress is overwhelming. If I can't afford

child care, it puts my education and training as a school

psychologist at risk."
