After three years of temporary waivers, family fee reform is finally permanent in 2023.

Now, there is no cost for child care for families with low incomes.



Helping Family Child Care Providers Stay in Business



Teaming up with housing experts to end discrimination against family child care providers

Family child care homes are important for communities, helping working families breathe easy. And owning a child care business can also be a viable economic opportunity and door to entrepreneurship. But due to a legacy of laws rooted in racism and discrimination, many providers have been forced to close. However, in the past year, 1,905 child care providers have expanded their programs, reversing the trend of closures over the past decade.

Thanks to your support, we are overturning burdensome rules and policies to create economic opportunity for child care providers. When landlords try to raise the rent, say running a child care isn't allowed, or refuse to rent to a family child care provider, our housing team steps in.

As a result, more child care providers are secure in their homes and businesses:

in refunds for child care providers when cities overcharged for zoning, fire or business permits

Everyone



who met June was inspired to do all they could for children! When June passed away at age 98, we were honored to be listed as one of her favorite charities.

Carol Stevenson was pregnant with her first child when she entered law school - and started a child care center there later on! After law school, she became a staff attorney at the Child Care Law Center, where she worked for 14 years.
