Securing Stable Child Care Makes Communities Stronger

Lawmakers and advocates rely on the Child Care Law Center to ensure that when new laws pass, they are equitable for every family.

For families, knowing you can count on a reliable and loving environment for your baby while you work is so important.

When most California families enroll their children in an affordable child care program, they are guaranteed 24 months of care. But this law unfairly excluded families with the lowest incomes.

This year, we helped policymakers fix the law. 140,000+ more children will benefit from uninterrupted child care for 24 months, beginning January 2025. Together with Thriving Families California, we made sure the law was equitable and racially just for all families with publicly funded child care in the state. Busy parents who are working, attending school, or to their family's needs will breathe easier with stable child care.



We make sure child care providers have the tools they need. It's a win-win for communities – providers can keep their doors open, and more families find nurturing care for their babies.



Family child care providers offer a vital service to their community. Working families depend on their enriching and flexible home-based child care programs. But a legacy of barriers rooted in racism has prevented child care providers – who are majority women of color – from getting ahead.



Supplying Providers With Legal Education

This year, we educated new family child care providers on their housing rights and pushed for language justice. Together with the International Rescue Committee (IRC) in Oakland, we hosted a workshop series in Farsi/Dari for providers new to the United States from Afghanistan.

As this cohort consists of refugees and humanitarian immigrants, opening their own family child care homes is helping them rebuild their lives in the US. Supplied with our legal information in their first language, these new business owners will provide hundreds more Oakland families with loving child care, close to home.



When we make the law more accessible and inclusive, providers & communities thrive

We hear from providers every day whose landlords tell them they cannot run a child care program from their rental home. This year we partnered with fair housing experts and child care providers to root out the major perpetrators of discrimination and take legal action.

Your support is helping us put an end to landlords' harmful intimidation tactics. By upholding the law, we make sure that child care providers are treated with the dignity and respect they deserve, now and in the future.

Assuring Legal Protection from Eviction



Family child care homes are vital to communities. Thanks to you, this year we helped keep child care programs open across the state.

In Watsonville, we helped a group of 8 child care providers defend their rights when their landlord unfairly tried to evict them from their mobile home park. Families love these providers – they offer a loving environment, speak the same language, and offer flexible hours.

We stopped the landlord from evicting the providers, together with the local legal aid organization. Now, these child care providers can breathe easier, and more than 50 families will continue to receive nurturing care.


